September 18. If you have any questions, feel free to contact the office at 502-732-7030.



Tired of asking your kids or grandkids the same old "How was your day?" and getting one-word answers?

You're not alone. After school, kids often need a little time and a snack before they're ready to share. The trick is to give them space and ask questions that spark real conversation.

When you reconnect after being apart, try these simple steps:

- Listen without rushing to fill the silence.

Then, instead of the usual question, try one of these:

- Tell me something that made you laugh.

- •What made you frustrated?

Super Patriotic Dip

Servings:28 Serving Size: 1/4 cup

Ingredients:

- 1 cup light sour cream
- 1 tablespoon chili powder
- 1 teaspoon garlic powder
- 1 teaspoon paprika
- ½ teaspoon salt
- 2 (15 ounce) cans no salt added black beans, rinsed and drained
- 1 cup thick and chunky salsa
- 1 ½ cups guacamole
- 1 cup shredded mozzarella cheese
- 1 cup cherry tomatoes, halved lengthwise
- Baked tortilla chips


Directions:

- In a small bowl, mix the sour cream, chili powder, garlic powder, paprika and salt. Set aside.
- Reserve about ½ cup black beans. In a 9"x7" (or similar size) clear casserole dish or pan, evenly layer remaining black beans.
- Over black beans, layer, sour cream, salsa and guacamole.
- Create an American flag or other patriotic design on top by using black beans, cheese and tomatoes.
- Serve with baked tortilla chips.

FOOD FACTS



What is Guacamole?

Guacamole is basically mashed, raw avocados mixed with other ingredients to taste. The avocados give guacamole the green base, and other ingredients, such as tomatoes and onions give it some textured flavor. Guacamole is especially popular on Super Bowl Sunday and Cinco de Mayo. This treat is a perfect tailgate or party snack and a favorite Mexican restaurant side dish. Guacamole, due to its base of avocados are also super healthy. Guacamole has been linked to improving heart, skin, and hair health, as well as contributing to weight loss, cancer prevention, and a stronger immune and digestive system.

Guacamole History: A Mexican Food?

The history of this tasty treat dates back to the Aztec Empire in Central America during the 1500s. Avocados were a favorite fruit in the area, and the Aztecs loved their "ahuaca-mulli" or avocado-mixture. The Spaniards also loved this treat, but could not pronounce the name correctly. This tasty spread first included avocados, tomatoes, and chilis, but over the years the Spaniards started adding their own ingredients, like onions, cilantro and lime juice. With time, the Spanish pronunciation changed the name of this dish to guacamole. The Spaniards had trouble growing avocados back in Spain, leaving guacamole a popular Mexican food item in the Americas. Today, guacamole sales are steadily increasing, because it is so healthy and delicious.
